Social Media & Internet Usage Guide for Mentors

Skype and Other Video Conferencing Options

There are now many video conferencing options available. Choose whatever one best suits your needs. Skype has been out there a long time, so information is being provided for that service, but in general, for any of these services:

• Mentors are not required to set up or use this option, or to accept contact requests from clients in any of these services. This is completely optional only if you wish to do so.

Skype can be used to message, call or have a video conference with one or more people. <u>Tips for Setting Up and Using Skype:</u>

- Download Skype onto your computer, tablet or phone
- Set up your User Name so that it is easy to remember and find; e.g., FirstName.LastName. If that name is already used, add some easy to remember numbers
- Test your microphone and camera. It will probably ask you to do this as part of your setup.
- Make a test call to make sure it is working correctly.
- To find someone who already has a Skype account, search their name in the search box. Skype will provide you with a list of possibilities.
- To add someone without a Skype account, click the add person button (person symbol with a + sign) and provide their phone number.

Facebook

- Facebook can be used to privately communicate with someone through Messenger.
- Mentors are not required to accept friend requests from clients if they do not wish to do so.
- You can add the Messenger app to your phone for convenient access to your Messages without going through your Facebook account first. If you receive messages, a number will appear on the icon with the number of unread messages you have.
